### **Celebrating the Saints**

*Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us.*

*Hebrews 12:1*

On the first day of November the church celebrates the saints, that great cloud of witnesses, who throughout history bore witness to the grace and power of Jesus Christ in their lives.

The writer of Hebrew uses the image of a race to describe the life of witness and mission. Each generation of saints runs the race set before it. Then it passes the baton to another generation. I imagine the cloud of witness as those saints who have run the race and passed the baton on to us. They are cheering us on.

Through the ages, God invites the saints to run the race of witness and mission. Mission is why the church of Jesus Christ exists. As the body of Christ we exist, not for ourselves, but for the sake of the world. We are mindful of those we need to reach with the good news of Jesus. We are mindful of those to whom we will pass the baton.

On November 18, 2018, Holy Cross will celebrate its 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as a congregation. This too is a celebration of saints. We will remember those saints who founded Holy Cross and passed the baton on to us. We will celebrate our life together as God's witnesses in this place and time.

The Rev. Ed Harper, who was our longest serving and perhaps one of our most beloved pastors, will preach that Sunday. The archive team is preparing some special displays about the history of Holy Cross and the people that make it special.

Yet, even as we celebrate our past, we look to our future. Our theme for 2018 has been *Building on the Best*. The question before us is how will we **build on the best** for the generations that follow?

Over the summer your leadership began discussing a capital campaign. The challenge is to raise an additional \$200,000 in new money, over and above what we normally receive in offerings, during the course of the next three years. This will allow us to cover the costs of necessary maintenance to our facility as well as to fund additional ministries, including our commitment of \$14,000 to the synod's **New Connections** Campaign. It is our way of "building on the best of our past to bridge to our future," as we join in God's mission for the sake of the world.

We will be asking each of you to consider how you can be a part of **building on the best** and **making new connections**. How shall Holy Cross steward its resources, its property, its treasure, its staff time, and its volunteer energy to bring Jesus to a world sorely in need of healing? How will you be a part of this as we celebrate our 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary?

## FROM THE DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

*Now thank we all our God, with hearts and hands  
and **VOICES**.*

Every year at Thanksgiving most families sit down to dinner and start one by one stating something they are thankful for.

Ministries it makes sense that I would write about how we use our voices to give thanks and praise to God. However, there is so much more to giving thanks and praise to God with our voices than simply singing. We are Lutherans. We have (in my humble opinion) the best hymnody out there. We are known for our confident four-part singing of bold Lutheran chorales. We have the singing part of using our voices down. We must also give thanks to God with our voices by evangelizing!

In Pastor Johnson's first sermon at Holy Cross she mentioned the typical Lutheran method of evangelism. Simply standing in a boat and shouting, "Here fishy, fishy!" Many of us are afraid of evangelism because we think that means beating someone over the head with your religious beliefs until they believe what you believe. It is understandable. That model of evangelism is seen in use all too often.

At the heart of the word evangelism is the word *evangelion*. The Greek word for gospel, or "good news." As evangelists we need to go out and share the good news. We need to tell others what God has done for us. We don't need to worry about how many people we convert, but how often we share with others the things we are grateful for.

Everyone has days when they are depressed and feel like nothing could possibly go their way. God never promised us a perfect life. God promised us Himself! Even in times of trouble we can always rest assured in the fact that we have God to lean on. That is certainly something we can give thanks for!

In addition to belting out all three stanzas of *Now Thank We All Our God* this November we also need to remember to use our voices as Christians in the community. Remember that you always have something to be thankful for and reminding someone else of that will more than likely cause them to think of more things they can give thanks and praise to God for.

### **Now Thank We All Our God**

*“Give thanks in all circumstances;  
for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.”  
1 Thessalonians 5:18*

Martin Rinkart, a Lutheran minister, was in Eilenburg, Saxony, during the Thirty Years’ War. This walled city became home to many refugees due to the war. After the Swedish army surrounded the city famine and plague began to run rampant. Hundreds of homes were destroyed and people began to perish. Pastors who were already stretched to their limits performed dozens of funerals a day. Not too long into the tragedy Rinkart was the only minister left in Eilenburg - performing more than fifty funerals a day (including his own wife). When the Swedes demanded a huge ransom, Rinkart left the safety of the walls and pleaded for mercy. The Swedish commander was impressed by his faith and courage and lowered his demands. Soon after this event the Thirty Years’ War ended, and Rinkart wrote the hymn, *Now Thank We All Our God*, for a grand celebration service. Rinkart was able to use his faith to lead

him beyond his feelings of depression. He would often go to the Bible to find reasons to trust in God's presence. It is a testament to his faith that, after such misery, he was able to write a hymn of abiding trust and gratitude toward God.

*Now thank we all our God, with heart and hands and voices,  
Who wondrous things has done, in Whom this world rejoices;  
Who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way  
With countless gifts of love, and still is ours today.*


### **SCHEDULE CHANGE ON NOVEMBER 18<sup>TH</sup>**

### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN — BUILDING ON THE BEST



#### **Our Goal: \$200,000**

Holy Cross is committed to building on the best of our church to extend and revitalize our ministry. We aspire to grow Holy Cross by making forty-eight new connections to our congregation over the next three years, with an emphasis on attracting families and youth, and building more powerful relationships among our members. In order to achieve this, we plan to raise \$200,000 by the end of 2021:

***\$35,000 to build on our evangelical mission***, to strengthen our connections in the community. We will participate in community events, such as the Herndon Festival and SterlingFest to raise awareness of our mission. We will initiate fun, community-based

activities such as “Beer and Carols” to bring our message into the community more effectively. We will partner with Herndon Middle School and the Neighborhood Resource Center to support community youth. We will provide opportunities for children and youth to serve, both in worship and the community.

***\$14,000 is designated to build the broader church.*** With the encouragement and support of synod’s New Connections Campaign, Holy Cross aspires to build *new connections* to 48 new people over the next three years. We will also contribute \$14,000 to the synod’s efforts to provide training, coaching and resources to grow the synod by 3000 new people over the next three years. Holy Cross is committed to joining in with other congregations in our Metropolitan Washington DC Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to make new connections so that others may know the fullness of life in Christ Jesus!

***\$151,000 is earmarked to build our facilities, to make them more inviting for families.*** We plan to repair and refresh our facilities, including new flooring for the fellowship hall, renovating the restrooms beside the fellowship hall, replacing the roof on the administrative wing and improving our technology in the fellowship hall and some classrooms.

In order to reach our Capital Campaign goal, gifts of all sizes are needed, from the largest leadership gifts to coins from our children.

The chart below shows how many gifts we need of each amount to fulfill the dream of upgrading our ministry facility and reaching out in our community.






## Holy Cross Blood Drive

# A passion for justice —and Jesus

A simple pot of rice and beans originally brought Eidas Rivas to Santuario Luterano, Waltham, Mass. Rivas, who is 34, made them at her mother's request for a potluck following evening worship. She hadn't planned on getting involved at Santuario; her intention was to "just come that Sunday and be done with it."

But it was the way the community embraced her three children—all with special needs—that kept Rivas coming back. Today she's deeply invested in the new ELCA congregation and so are her children, who serve as acolytes there.

For Rivas, belonging to Santuario is important because "we do a lot of social justice." This passion for service is a common thread among the congregation's young Latino membership, said Angel Marrero, pastor and mission developer there.

Members lead a variety of outreach efforts, including a free food pantry, GED classes and more. Last fall, in the wake of Hurricane Maria, Rivas and two other young adults at Santuario organized a donation drive for Puerto Rican families whose lives were devastated by the disaster.

Rivas remembers the constant flow of people and donations and calling Marrero to announce that a 24-foot truck had arrived—full of canned food for the people on the island.

"I was expecting 10 boxes," Marrero said of the effort. "We filled two airplanes (of donations) out of this mission church!"

He said the event was a turning point in his ministry with Santuario. New young people had found the congregation through it and asked him: "What's keeping you all together?"

Marrero answered,

Now 78 people—and counting—are involved in Santuario's life and ministry, a reality that wouldn't be possible, Marrero said, without Mission Support.

**Mission Support from the ELCA New England Synod and the ELCA churchwide organization fund Marrero's work with Santuario, which shares space and a partnership with First Lutheran Church of Waltham.**

"The dollars you put in your offering ... is what allows me the freedom to work in Waltham [with the Latino community]," Marrero said. "Through the partnership with the larger church, it is possible to do ministry among them."
