Learn from the Hymns

A bible study based on popular hymns

Presented on Zoom – Tuesdays – 7:00 PM

(Starting September 1)

As Holy Cross' program year begins during a pandemic, it holds directly in front of us that we still cannot gather in person to sing. Instead of choir and bell choir rehearsals this fall I will be holding a weekly Zoom bible study based on hymns and other sacred music. The link you need for Zoom will be emailed out weekly prior to the bible study. Please make sure you are on the church's email list. There is a participant guide that will be emailed out as well.

Feel free to share this information with your friends. ALL are welcome!

September 1: Holy, Holy, Holy

Holy, Holy, Holy has been sung in Christian churches since the 1800's. Our mouths have probably formed the words of this hymn so frequently that we no longer pay attention to them. This study will examine the background and meaning of this classic hymn.

What exactly does "holy" mean? Why is "holy" repeated three times? Can the study of this hymn affect our view of God and our life on Earth?

Scripture: Exodus 33:12-23

Matthew 3:12-17 Revelation 4:1-11

September 8: Amazing Grace

Amazing Grace is one of the most popular and well-known hymns of all time. Written by an "old converted sea captain" who truly appreciated the mercy God extended to him, it helps us to value God's grace. Grace changes lives, empowering us to live beyond our fears and troubles.

Why is grace amazing? How is fear changed by grace? Does grace continue its work even after we have become Christians?

Scripture: Psalm 118:1-14

2 Corinthians 12:7-10 Ephesians 2:1-10

September 15: Have Thine Own Way, Lord

Written by a discouraged missionary, *Have Thine Own Way, Lord* has become an abiding prayer of yielding to the Lord. Her words teach us that we are clay in the Master Potter's hands. Although it may be challenging, when we submit to the Potter's touch, we experience the joy of God's perfect will.

Why is God depicted as a potter? What is the first step in surrendering to the Lord? What results will we see because of our trust and submission?

Scripture: Psalm 51:1–19

Isaiah 45:5-12

2 Corinthians 4:7-12

September 22: It Is Well with My Soul

Most of us have sung the beautiful hymn It *Is Well with My Soul* for years without realizing that it was written by a man who experienced great personal loss. Even in the midst of his tragedy, he was able to exult in God's goodness. This great hymn encourages our souls to praise our gracious God whatever our circumstances.

Scripture: Psalm 42:1–11

Psalm 103:1–22 Romans 8:31–39

September 29: Jesus, Lover of My Soul

Written by a man who penned thousands of hymns, *Jesus*, *Lover of My Soul* is one of the most beloved texts of hymnody. Its stirring words speak of a personal and intimate relationship with Christ. It reveals Jesus as Lover, Protector, and Provider.

Do you have an intimate knowledge of Jesus' love? Are you aware of his protection? Do you rely on Christ's provision?

Scripture: Psalm 18:1–36

Psalm 23:1–6 Luke 15:11–32

October 6: Come, Thou Fount

Come, Thou Fount was written by a man who experienced a dramatic conversion from gang member to preacher. The hymn acknowledges God as the giver of every blessing. It praises the God who seeks us out when we are straying and asks him to unite our hearts with God's so that we never wander away again.

Who receives praise for the blessings we are given? How can we commemorate God's actions on our behalf? How can we avoid wandering away from our Savior?

Scripture: Deuteronomy 8:6–20

1 Samuel 7:2–13 Ephesians 1:3–10

I hope you are able to join us on Zoom for this time of fellowship, bible study, and prayer. Please let me know if you have any questions.


COUNCIL NEWS



HCLC COVID-19 UPDATE - Aug. 2020

While restrictions on worship have eased, the guidance from the Virginia Governor's office is that members are still safer at home. With that in mind, Holy Cross will continue to provide Sunday morning worship services in an online format.

In September we will begin experimenting with an outdoor, midweek worship series called "More Days for Praise!". Wednesday evening services will be held outdoors, where worshippers can participate from within their car (via an FM radio signal), or in lawn chairs outside. For people gathering on the lawn, social distancing will be strictly enforced, and masks are required. There will be no singing to help mitigate against the spread of COVID-19.


Compassion Camp At-Home Vacation Bible School Joy


Like we did last spring, a Zoom link will be sent out with the Weekly Update for that week.

This thoughtful and engaging curriculum is from Illustrated Ministries, the same source as for our Compassion Camp VBS.



\$624,000 in Humanitarian Aid Destroyed in Beirut Explosion

<u>Lutheran World Relief</u> recently learned that three 40-foot shipping containers filled with thousands of handmade mission quilts and school, personal and baby care kits were destroyed in the devastating August 4 explosions at the port of Beirut, Lebanon.

The shipment was destined for refugees living in Lebanon, principally from Syria and the Palestinian territories. The containers were part of a shipment to be distributed by <u>Anera</u>, an NGO and longtime Lutheran World Relief partner that serves refugees and other vulnerable communities in the Middle East. The total value of the lost shipments was approximately \$624,000.

The loss of more than 47,000 quilts, sewn by individuals and members of Lutheran congregations across the U.S., could mean a more bitter winter for thousands of refugees. Help replace the kits and quilts by learning more here. To donate, visit https://lwr.org/beirut
