HCLC COVID-19 UPDATE Aug. 2020



While restrictions on worship have eased, the guidance from the Virginia Governor's office is that members are still safer at home. With that in mind, Holy Cross will continue to provide Sunday morning worship services in an online format.

In September we began experimenting with an outdoor, midweek worship series called "More Days for Praise!". Wednesday evening services are held outdoors, where worshippers can participate from within their car (via an FM radio signal), or in lawn chairs outside. For people gathering on the lawn, social distancing is strictly enforced, and masks are required. There is no singing to help mitigate against the spread of COVID-19.

Holy Cross has been approached by Herndon Middle School to help a family who is in dire need of items to be replaced after their home was flooded with raw sewage. This is a list of clothes they need with sizes, as well as household furniture and goods. Our church family has been so generous in the past and we need your support again. Below is the family's response to the question of what they need:

"We have lost a lot. I'm not sure what you are able to help with, but any help at all is very much appreciated.

Sizes for everyone

3 yr boy size 4t/5t clothing size 10 toddler (shoe size 5 diapers and wipes we can really use if any)

5 yr girl size 8/10 girl's size 1 shoe

6 yr girl size 12/14 or Lg girl size 5 shoe

8 yr boy size 14 boys size 5 shoe

13 boy size Lg teen (prefer jogger/sweat pants or active wear) shoe size 9 1/2 mens

15 boy size Lg teen (prefer jogger/sweat pants or active wear) shoe size 10 mens

19 women size Large pants and shirts shoes 9 1/2 women's and 8 1/2 men's

Mom size Large. Shoes 9 1/2

Dad size Large shirts pants 36/34 shoes size 10

We also lost four of the children's bed sets all twin bed sets, headboards all 4 dressers, their tv and gaming systems, we lost a three piece sofa set, all sitting room furniture, tv, tables, lamps, the kids had a large collection of books, almost of their toys, all the kids play room furniture was damaged, kids tables and little rockers, 2 large area rugs, blankets, pillows, towels, wash clothes.
