

Dear Friends in Jesus,



Healing is in the forefront of my mind this month. My own walk with day-by-day sobriety is a journey of both healing and hope. The healing comes from my conscious connection with God and my willingness to let myself be molded by God's will and power and not my own. It is

a daily reprieve from a progressive, fatal disease. There is healing and hope in this program, a freedom from addiction and a more wholistic way of living my life in service to others. It is a path that sees joy in life, a path of wholeness.

Later this month, I will travel to spend some of my time with my mother. While that is always a precious gift, I will also be giving my younger sister and her family a period of respite, since they are the ones who provide full-time care for mom. My older sister and I will tag-team this time, giving our sister's family a full three weeks of vacation together. That is a gift of healing for them, and we are glad that we have the opportunity to be there for them as well as for our mom.

My mother is 91 and I am fully aware that there is not a physical healing from the reality of old age. She is likely closer to her death than most of us. But the time with her is a time of hope and healing. Time together is precious, no matter our age, and I anticipate that the days we are able to spend with her will be ones of making memories, sharing the stories she still remembers, and just being together again in the love we have for one another. That is healing,

that is hope-filled, and that is holy time together.

Of course, I am also thinking about my surgery, which is scheduled for August 31. It is brain surgery, so it is a major undertaking, so much so that the surgeon recommends weeks of time off to fully heal. To be honest, I have a lot of anxiety about the whole process. True, the hospital, Johns Hopkins, is one of the best in the land and my surgeon is the Dean



of Neurology there. The surgery she will perform is part of her specialty, one she has performed many times. Still, it is a big unknown, and we as humans are hotwired to be warry of unknown things that have the capacity to drastically change our health or mortality. It's hope that helps me face this uncertainty. It's that reminder that the result is out of my hands, that I am literally placing my body in the hands of a team of medical experts, and the assurance that the surgery and healing period will be one surrounded by the love and prayers of so many. Hope is also the promise that whatever the outcome, Jesus has promised to never leave me nor forsake me. His love endures.

In the First Letter to the Corinthians, The Apostle writes about the people of God as the Body of Christ and reminds us that as one member suffers, so do we all. Our common healing and hope are intertwined, and we support one another as we face the everyday challenges, or suffering, or disease, or conflict. In our walk through life, in our recovery from whatever afflicts us, God is there. As we face the end of this life, either for ourselves or those we love, God is there. As we confront the unknown challenges that rise before us, God is there. God is there in it all and for us all. In this way, we can see, through the eyes of hope, that healing is not only a physical removal of our distresses, but also an inner peace that comes from the hope that holds us in God's love.

We Need You In The Choir!!! Due to the transient nature of the Metro DC area we have lost a number of choir members since I have been here. It is time to once again fill the choir seats!!!

As the summer ends and the school year begins, so do choir rehearsals. It is my goal to fill every seat in the choir area this year! In order to do that – **We Need You In The Choir!!!**

We gather every Thursday from 7:00 - 8:00 pm and we sing at alternating services (8:30 and 11:00 am) throughout the year.

A lot of people think they can't sing or aren't good enough for the choir. If you can sing a hymn, you can join the choir! There are confident voices throughout the choir to sit next to and help you get acclimated.

So you may be thinking, "What exactly is the role of the choir in worship?" or, "Why is the choir so important that you need *me* to be a part of it?" The following passage is taken from the ELCA's statement on the role of choirs in worship:

"Obviously, the choir has a variety of responsibilities. Their primary role is to support and enhance the congregation in song. As such, the choir becomes an important leader in worship, guiding the gathered assembly in prayer and praise through song.

Do our choirs need to be filled with professional singers? Absolutely not! Any choir can sing well, provided the music is appropriate to their skill level and they are well-trained and rehearsed. Music that is simple and well taught provides choirs with a means to get beyond the mechanics



and give heartfelt expression to the text. This music, in turn, can provide the whole assembly with a means truly to encounter God in its worship.

The choir may be called upon to act as teacher, to help the assembly learn new hymnody and musical settings of the liturgy; if the congregation is to learn new music quickly and accurately, the people must have enthusiastic and competent leadership. Above all, the well-rehearsed choir will breathe life into the text as it sings with clear understanding and insight into the words and their meaning. The texts can shape the faith of those who worship."

If you have any questions about the choir, please do not hesitate to pull me aside on a Sunday morning or give me a call at the office. You can always talk to any of the current choir members. They would love to have you as much as I would! Some of them may be approaching you on Sunday mornings as well!

Please prayerfully consider this opportunity to express your faith and offer your talents to HCLC.

Our Home

Holy Cross Family -

I start these missives by addressing them to our "Holy Cross Family." I use that term because we are all God's children, and it denotes a deeper connection than mere "community," although we are that as well. As family, we provide a "home." In an idealized sense, a home is a place where we are always welcome and safe, where we gain nourishment and support, where we celebrate each other's triumphs and share each other's burdens. It's a place where we are lifted up when we are down, and others can provide faith to see us through when we doubt.

This last point was driven home to me during a sermon at the Chautauqua Institution by the recently retired President of the Princeton Theological Seminary, the Reverend Dr. M. Craig Barnes. In the text of Chapter 2 of the Gospel of Mark, we hear the story about how Jesus was back home



in the city of Capernaum. After word got out, many people gathered there so that a group of four men who were carrying a paralyzed man on a bed could not make it through the crowd. Undeterred, they went up on the roof and cut a hole through it and lowered the man's bed down to Jesus. I'm sure you are familiar

with this story, as the big point in most sermons is about Jesus' healing on the sabbath and how the Scribes chastised him for blasphemy.

What Dr. Barnes emphasized, though, was verse 5, "When Jesus saw **their** faith, he said to the paralyzed man, 'Son, your sins are forgiven.'" In other stories of Jesus healing people, it is their faith that is mentioned; in

this case, it is the faith of the ones who carried the paralyzed man! Sometimes, we just need the help of those who care for us to provide the faith we may be missing when we are suffering.

Our Holy Cross family provides that still point in a turning world where we share our joys, troubles, doubts, and fears. It's where we share our faith with and for each other.






daughter Beth for setting up, providing the toppings and serving the hoards. Emily is from Harbor House and heard about the event thanks to event thanks to Tibbie Preston!





We completed our summer semester on July 26th, which started June 14th, and was free of charge! We always have a smaller number of students in the summer, but we did have 20 students from seven countries this time, a successful semester, and we still got one or two new students almost every week.

We'll start our fall semester on September 13th and continue



until December 6th. We teach Wednesdays from 7:00-8:30 pm.

Students in our basic and intermediate classes work with two books, a student book and a matching workbook. Students in our beginner class use a picture book with daily activities to study English. The picture book helps our beginners to

understand words that convey meaning. Students learn to connect the pictures in the book with the words on the page. We create separate lesson plans teaching grammar, sentence structure, and American customs. We also have fun teaching students slang words, expressions and meanings, plus helping them understand idioms.



One of our intermediate students, Patricia, who was a dentist in her country is working as a dental hygienist with several dentists in Reston while studying to become a dentist in the US. She also attended our ELL class. She was accepted at the University of Chicago for the Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) program. She plans to move to Chicago by the end of July. We are very happy and proud of her accomplishments. Congratulations, Patricia!
