

Now in peace I will lie down and sleep; you alone, O God, make me secure. ELW Night Prayer – Compline

This quote from Psalm 4 has long been a beloved one for me. It's also part of the Compline liturgy. Coming at the end of that worship, it serves as a comforting reminder of God's promise and protection in the face of uncertainty. Perhaps that is why I love this worship service so much; it helps me to trust that the concerns and worries of the day are now over, and I am invited to give them back to God for safe keeping.

Some years ago, I was taught a simple spiritual practice that I do my best to maintain. Before I lay down, I try to remember all the major events of the day. For those things that I have done or didn't do, that I believe go against God's will, I ask forgiveness. If there are apologies that I need to make, I try to make a mental note to attend to them the next day. If there are things that were beautiful, acts of kindness I have received, or things that I was able to do that were helpful or good, I give thanks to God. Finally, if there are worries or unaccomplished tasks to do, I try to give them up to God. I don't always fully succeed, but I try.

I spend a lot of my awake time trying my best to run the world. It's rarely successful. At the close of the day my head and heart are pretty full, especially of frustrations and exasperations for the things I haven't or shouldn't have done. When I do this simple evening practice, I find that I can better try to give up impossible expectations and the subsequent

feelings of failure that seem to crowd in my head just as I try to get some rest. It also gives me an opportunity to focus on the good things that I have done or have experienced. In this way, my mind is reset, and I come to realize that it hasn't been such a bad day after all, especially when I stopped playing God and allowed myself to see the Creation for what it is: GOD'S.

September will be for me a month of unknowns and restoration. No doubt, I'll spend most of the month frustrated that I can't just bounce back after my surgery. We all face doubts, we all face unknown things in life. But like all unknowns, including even sleep, we ultimately need to heed the Psalmist words: *Now in peace I will lie down and sleep; you alone, O God, make me secure.*

Rest well my friends. May we all rise to serve God in peace.

Earth and All Stars! is one of my favorite hymns to sing. On its surface, it is one of the stranger texts in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal. With phrases like "Loud rushing planets!", or "Loud boiling test tubes!", or even "Engines and steel! Loud pounding hammers!" you may be asking why on earth are we singing this hymn. However after a brief history lesson in hymnody, one can see the beauty of these phrases and why we sing it in church. Specifically, HCLC sings it every year as the students and teachers go back to school.

Herbert Brokering's text, *Earth and All Stars!*, calls the universe to unite and "Sing to the Lord a new song." In addition to addressing the natural universe that Psalm 148 catalogs ("mountains and hills," "beasts and cattle," "birds of the air," etc.), "Earth and All Stars" also calls on music, industry, construction, education, sports, and philosophy, the entire human enterprise, to join the song. Each image is bound together by the recurring phrase found in each stanza, "Sing to the Lord a new song! He has done marvelous things. I too will praise him with a new song!"

Brokering, a Lutheran minister born in 1926, composed this text in 1964 on the occasion of the 90th anniversary of St. Olaf College. With phrases like "Classroom and labs!" and "Athlete and band!" it is easy to see the academic world references in stanzas four and five.

I invite you to use this hymn text in your daily devotionals as students and teachers return to the classroom.

Classrooms and labs! Loud boiling test tubes! Sing to the Lord a new song! Athlete and band! Loud cheering people! Sing to the Lord a new song!

God has done marvelous things. I too sing praises with a new song!

Cranking Back Up!

Holy Cross Family -

I often approach this time of year with mixed emotions. I begin to realize the relatively carefree days of summer are coming to an end, and fall with all of its activities and exciting events is right around the corner.

This year we have had an unusual number of problems to address with our building and property. Fortunately, our Property Chair, Gary Wolfe, and his team (esp. Joe Makowski and his son) have been able to supply much of the labor needed to address them. However, as these expenses were increasing, we were experiencing a decrease in contributions. Thus, there is a growing need to collectively add to the Infrastructure and Development fund. We also ask that you consider including Holy Cross in your estate planning as was done with the Gouldman Fund which has grown from a relatively small beguest in 1977 to benefit us numerous ways. The stalled bathroom project is now moving forward after the injection of the Rebuild Virginia grant replaced the shortfall in Building on the Best pledge fulfillments. Additionally, a small amount of the Rebuild Virginia grant was used to procure an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and its cabinet that will be installed in the narthex opposite the restrooms during September.

We had another successful Vacation Bible School (VBS) thanks to Suzanne Baggett and her staff. Pastor Martin (AKA Super Meerkat), Jeremy Shoop (AKA Professor) provided a dynamic opening skit. Adult Study led by Pastor Martin filled the large classroom, Katy Moran shared her growing skills and infectious enthusiasm, Amy McNaughton led the kids to make casseroles for Lunch for the Soul participants, and Chris Nelson worked directly with the kids to make creature boxes for HCLC's habitat. So much work was done by so many to ensure another successful VBS! Thanks to these amazing people; we really appreciate all you do for Holy Cross!

Rally Day is coming up on September 10th. This is when we traditionally focus on our ministry teams and kick off a new year of Sunday School. This year we will have a special focus on Outreach Ministries at Holy Cross. Activities will be held between services, so please plan on staying later or coming earlier depending on which service you normally attend.

In November, Holy Cross will celebrate its 60th Anniversary! Our celebrations will culminate with a special worship service and a catered luncheon on All Saints Sunday, November 5th. Mark your calendars now for this wonderful event!

Finally, please keep Pastor Martin in your prayers for a successful surgery and recovery. He is blessed that the top surgeon in the country on this procedure is at Johns Hopkins, and she is his doctor!

I'm looking forward to us moving our activities into high gear with the entire Holy Cross Family as summer concludes and fall begins!

Under Chris Nelson's wonderful leadership, our VBS kids made creature boxes for HCLC's habitat!





- Hair brushes



2. Donations of gently used shoes to <u>Soles4Souls</u>.

Gently used shoes are sent to developing countries, where small business owners sell them for income and their customers receive affordable quality shoes. Chaplaincy Ministries

The ELCA Federal Chaplaincy Ministries Office supports pastors who serve as federal chaplains for the U.S. military, Veterans Affairs hospitals and federal correctional institutions. These individuals bring the hope, help and healing of Christ to service members, veterans, the imprisoned and federal law enforcement. For ELCA Deacons and Pastors, the ELCA Chaplaincy and Specialized Pastoral Care office facilitates required endorsements and supports chaplains through prayer, providing worship materials, and partners with others to send care packages to deployed military chaplains. *HCLC Connection*: Funds raised from the HCLC Beer and Carols event in December are dedicated to the ELCA Federal Chaplaincy Ministries Office.







The Closet of the Greater Herndon Area, Inc.

The Closet is a nonprofit thrift shop in the heart of historic downtown Herndon, Virginia. Founded in 1974 by a handful of churches to assist low-income families by selling used clothing at nominal prices, The Closet's mission has expanded to become a significant resource for the greater Herndon area. The shop continues to be a source of low-cost clothing and household necessities for families and individuals on a tight budget and also gives away clothing at no cost to truly needy individuals. Profits from The Closet go to support local community service organizations as well as post-secondary education scholarships for students from local high schools.

HCLC Connection: HCLC is one of 20 faith-based organizations that manages The Closet. HCLC members volunteer at the shop.

Cornerstones

Cornerstones is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that promotes self-sufficiency by providing support and advocacy for those in need of food, shelter, affordable housing, quality childcare, and other human services. Programs include the Embry Rucker Community Shelter, as well as supported housing, food and financial assistance, employment services, and community and family strengthening programs.

HCLC Connection: HCLC collects donations of food for the Embry Rucker Community Shelter on the third Sunday of each month.

LAWS - Loudoun Abused Women's Shelter

LAWS Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Services is Loudoun County's designated provider for survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and child abuse. We provide free and confidential services, including our 24/7 survivor hotline, advocacy and brief trauma therapy, legal

services, and violence prevention programs. LAWS also operates Loudoun County's domestic violence shelter, the Loudoun Child Advocacy Center, and The Resourceful Woman Thrift Store.

HCLC Connection: HCLC has donated items for the domestic violence shelter.

LINK Against Hunger

LINK, Inc. is a 501c(3) non-profit organization that provides emergency food and financial assistance to qualified people in need. Supported primarily by donations of food and funds, LINK is comprised of dedicated churches, organizations, and individuals serving the Herndon, Sterling, and Ashburn, Virginia communities. The all-volunteer staff at LINK believe in the power of selfless service and the importance of providing people in crisis with unconditional love. Volunteers deliver emergency food supplies to families in need on a weekly basis. The organization also operates a mobile food pantry and holiday distributions of food, coats, and gifts.

HCLC Connection: HCLC collects donations of food for LINK on the first Sunday of each month and members of HCLC deliver groceries to recipients on a weekly basis. We also have a seat on the board of directors.

Lutheran Social Services of the National Capital Area

Lutheran Social Services of the National Capital Area (LSSNCA) accompanies those in need to foster resiliency, selfsufficiency, and access to opportunities by creating, connecting with, and engaging welcoming communities. LSSNCA specifically focuses their efforts on some of the most vulnerable in our community: refugees, asylum-seekers, unaccompanied refugee minors, children needing foster homes, and family and youth wellness. LSSNCA has served the Metro DC area for over a hundred years.

HCLC Connection: HCLC has sponsored refugee families through the Immigration and Refugee Services. On Rally Day, we will collect supplies for The Resource Center managed by LSS-NCA.

Mobile Hope

Mobile Hope provides support and emergency shelter to youth up to age 24 who are at-risk, precariously housed or homeless and empowers them to become self-sufficient and experience improved well-being. Mobile Hope's Listen for the Honk fleet, including our iconic bus, has delivered fresh food, diapers, hygiene items, books, and toys to more than 320,000 family members since March of 2020. Our homeless youth and youth in crisis pitch in, working alongside Mobile Hope staff, corporate volunteers, and elected officials.

HCLC Connection: HCLC has collected donations of supplies for the organization to distribute to the youth they serve.

Student Peace Awards of Fairfax County

The Student Peace Awards of Fairfax County was begun in Herndon in 2006 to encourage everyone to think more about peace as both a means and an end, and to recognize young people who work as peacemakers. The program grew over time and is now offered to every public high school in Fairfax County. Each school is asked to nominate a student who has demonstrated a desire to bring kindness into the world around them, whether within their schools, their community, or on a larger scale. The students see conflict and injustice and respond with creative problem solving. Recognized students receive a monetary gift and may identify a peace-focused charity for a donation by the organization.

HCLC Connection: HCLC is a sponsoring organization of the Student Peace Awards, contributing annually to the scholarship fund.
